Australian airline cancels all flights - K. Procházková

Travelers are stranded and trying to get home after low-cost airline Bonza unexpectedly announced it has "temporarily suspended services." The airline, Australia's newest, had a fleet of six planes, all painted a bright purple color. According to a report in CNN affiliate 9News, Bonza is now in severe financial trouble.

Bonza's last Instagram post went up on April 28. And they wrote "We will immediately support any passengers stranded mid-journey by offering complimentary seats on Virgin Australia-operated flights to the airport nearest to their final planned Bonza destination," the airline wrote on X (formerly Twitter)"

Currently, the company's website is still online, but it's not possible to book flights and all travel dates appear blacked out.

Tourist hot spots are introducing entry fees and price hikes for 2024 - Šterclová

More and more tourist attractions are introducing visitor restrictions and entrance fees to avoid overcrowding. You also have to keep in mind that your favorite travel destinations are going to have more or increased fees. A lot of this is due to two things. Inflation and countries trying to combat over tourism. There are already over 30 countries with tourist tax fees and the number is just going up. Bali has already started implementing tourist tax, just because the overtourism in Bali is so bad and Barcelona is increasing their tourist tax for the third time. A new \$13 fee is charged for climbing Japan's famous Mount Fuji, following a 70% increase in price of tourist rail passes in Japan. However, due to the weak yen, it is still a good time for visitors to take this trip. If you want to explore the beautiful and extremely popular Plaza de España in Seville, Spain, expect to have to pay an entry fee and The Louvre art museum in Paris, where the Mona Lisa is located, has raised ticket prices by almost a third. Probably because of the upcoming Olympic Games in Paris this summer. It's not just Europe and Asia, either. Walt Disney World Resort in Florida has already introduced higher park ticket prices for next year of 2025.
